The children continue to pray for everyone working hard to look after others .


The staff would also like to thank all our families who work for the NHS or who are carers. God Bless you all.

The Month Of Mary



May is the month of Our Lady; Mary the Mother of God, who has a special place in our hearts, because she gave us the example of saying yes to God. She is a reminder to be faithful to God and we should strive to imitate our Blessed Mother's virtue in our own lives.

Ways in which we can honour Mary this month include:

- Praying the Rosary
- Learning the Hail Holy Queen prayer, or saying it regularly.
- Colouring, drawing or painting a picture of Mary
- Making a Prayer Corner in your house

I have attached resources to help you do this, to the next few pages of the newsletter.

A Prayer Corner at Home

Each class in St Chad's School has a prayer corner. It is a place where the children can retreat to and find Christ. The prayer corners give the children a focal area for prayer, quiet and listening, so that they may hear God's voice in their lives more clearly. It also provides a focal point for special times of the church's year.

I encourage you to make a prayer corner in your home, with your son/daughter. It doesn't need to be too elaborate. The main point is that it's a place designated for God, and more specifically, for spending time with him. Just as you need a proper atmosphere to sleep, you also need a proper atmosphere to pray. During this month of Mary, it could honour her and you could put pictures of her, a candle and some flowers on it. It could be a place where you read passages about Mary, from the Bible together, or where you could say the Rosary.


