

### Pope Francis's prayer request for January:

May the lord give us the grace to live in full fellowship with our brothers and sisters of other religions, praying for one another, open to all.



### The Epiphany

On Wednesday 6th January the children and staff in school shared a very special Zoom liturgy to celebrate the feast of the Epiphany. The children reflected on the importance and significance of the visit of the Magi, recognising the divine nature of Jesus, and were then asked to think about three gifts they could share.

All future Zoom liturgies will be uploaded to Google Classroom, so that all our children can engage with their faith and deepen their relationship with God.

## The Year of St Joseph

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from the, 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

#### A beloved, tender, obedient father

Saint Joseph, in fact, "concretely expressed his fatherhood" by making an offering of himself in love "a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home," writes Pope Francis, quoting his predecessor St Paul VI.



Joseph is also a father in obedience to God: with his 'fiat' he protects Mary and Jesus and teaches his Son to "do the will of the Father." Called by God to serve the mission of Jesus, he "cooperated... in the great mystery of Redemption," as St John Paul II said, "and is truly a minister of salvation".

#### Pope Francis also describes St Joseph as:

- Welcoming the will of God
- A creatively courageous father, example
- A father who teaches the value, dignity and joy of work of love
- A father "in the shadows," centred on Mary and Jesus


### Home Learning

## Gospel Values

### RSE - Integrity


"Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Luke 6:31)

This half term's Gospel Value focus is on Integrity. We will be focusing on the area of truth telling and honesty, teaching the children what it means and how they can live attitudes based on the gospel teachings of Jesus, with a commitment to truth, responsibility and purpose.

One of the first concepts we will share with the children, regarding integrity, is the importance of honesty. A person of integrity, is honest and fair in their words and deeds. They tell the truth and do not cheat or lie. It is good to acknowledge with the children, that our world and our culture often tempt us and pressure us to give in to the easy path. Having integrity often requires us to also have courage and fortitude.

#### Home Learning

The integrity PowerPoint will be available to share with your children, on both the school website and Google Classroom, please spend some time discussing the slides with your child/children and reinforcing this important message. It would be lovely if you could email the class teachers, if you believe that your son/daughter has really understood the message and is living the gospel value of integrity, as they can then be added to the list of those children who demonstrate integrity. They will then receive the sticker, when they return to school.
