

Gospel Values - Compassion

Our school gospel values laid out by Jesus in the Beatitudes provide an authentic foundation for helping the children to live like Christ. These values inform the whole life of the school, from RE and assemblies to classroom discipline.

This month we will be focusing on the gospel value of Compassion.

We held a special assembly on Friday 10th September, which explained what the gospel value of Compassion is and how the children can live it in their lives. It focused on the parable of the Good Samaritan and it encouraged the children to have the desire to act justly, with an attitude of kindness and forgiveness, with everyone we meet. The assembly also placed importance on recognising the dignity of every human person and appreciating difference and diversity. During the months of September and October, children will be receiving recognition for living this gospel value and will be rewarded in assembly.

Living Our Mission

To Love and to Serve

From this year we are we encouraging the children to serve as a witness to Our Lord Jesus Christ and to the Catholic faith, by recognising that they to can live a Christian Mission. We are helping the children to think about the ways they can share in the mission of bringing God's love to people close to home and far away.

Inspired by Pope Francis, and his recent Fratelli Tutti encyclical we are encouraging the children from Reception to Year 6 to think about the world as a global community and to think about putting the needs of others before themselves; be that their friends and family or those in need in our local or global community. We believe that each and every person is made in the image of Christ and should be treated with dignity, respect and love and we guide the children to enact these values. Empathy, compassion and forgiveness are promoted and offered to all in our daily

lives. We will be encouraging the children to follow Jesus' example: by praying, fundraising and becoming missionaries themselves.

Every classroom has a 'Living Our Mission' display, where the children have considered how they can be like Jesus, our 'Servant King', in the classroom, in the school and in our global community.
