We will be hosting our annual Advent Breakfast on **Wednesday 8th December, between 8:15** and 8:45, in the school hall. This is a lovely tradition, which allows you to sit and eat breakfast together with your children, before they begin the school day and provides us, working in partnership, the opportunity to raise funds for those in need.

The CAFOD Club children have asked that the money raised this year goes to purchasing 'World Gifts' for people in vulnerable situations this Christmas season.

We will be providing bacon rolls, croissants, brioche rolls, toast and cereal, along with tea/coffee or juice.

The hall will be decorated with your children's festive displays, to make it extra special.

Please be reassured, that due to Covid precautions, the tables will be spaced out and the doors will remain open.

Caring for God's Creation Lunday

We have been talking to the children about Pope Francis' letter 'Laudato Si', which encourages all people in the world to live simply, so that we do not use more than our fair share of the world resource. We are encouraging the children to recognise the need to protect God creation and to 'Live wisely, think deeply and Love generously' (Pope Francis).

With this in mind, we are suggesting that the children do not bring in individual Christmas cards for their whole class this year, instead there will be one large card in each class, where all the children can write their Christmas wishes to each other.

This is only a suggestion, so if your son/daughter really wants to bring in cards, then they can continue to do so.



Like Pope Francis, we hope that we can work together to create a better world for future generations, by making the necessary changes in our lives in order to take care of, respect and value our 'common home'.







CAFOD Club led Anti-bulling Week this year (15th–19th November), by reminding the children of the power of kindness and the affect kind words can have on those to whom they are spoken. The children shared the knowledge that little acts of consideration can break

down barriers and brighten the lives of the people around them and that one kind word leads to another. Kindness fuels kindness.

As one kind word can provide a moment of hope, the children then recorded their kind words and displayed them around the school. The Year 3/4 corridor, looks particularly beautiful, with kindness butterflies, displaying the kind words. In Upper KS2 the children wrote their kind word/act on a strip of blue paper, which were then joined together in a paper chain, demonstrating how one act of kindness, can lead to more.

My Personal Mission Statement


It is my mission to life a life of love, gentleness and compassion.




Christ the King

Thank you to all those 117 parents, who returned their Parental survey and for all the lovely comments you included on them. Below you will find the results.

The percentages look very encouraging, especially when Strongly agree and Agree are combined.

I think that it is important to mention that several parents referred to Covid restrictions for the reason they felt, they were not welcomed to the Catholic life of the school'. Now that Class Liturgies have begun again, and the nativity season is upon us, I hope that families will feel more welcomed to share in the Catholic life of the school.

Fr Ambrose and I are also working closely on developing school and parish links, and we have now begun a weekly Friday Mass rota for Year 2-6. Please feel welcomed to join us at 9:30 Mass at St Chad's Church, each Friday. Fr is also meeting with each class for a 'getting to know you session' and he has been very generous with his time.
