# Crowning Mary Liturgy







In school during the month of May we honour Mary, the mother of Jesus and we pray especially to her. Mary answered God's call to be the mother of Jesus.

In Our Crowning of Mary, Liturgy we honoured Mary who followed the will of God all her life. We recognised that Mary was faithful at the stable in Bethlehem, she was faithful on the flight to Egypt, and she was faithful at the foot of the cross.

We prayed that we would follow Mary's example and listen to God and do what God asks with joy.

The queen symbol was attributed to Mary because she was a perfect follower of Christ, who is the absolute "crown" of creation. She is the Mother of the Son of God.

Flowers have always been associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary. There is even an early tradition that states when the apostles went to open Mary's tomb, they found it filled with the most fragrant flowers, confirming that Jesus took her up to heaven after she died.





## The Feast of the Ascension

Year 3 led the school in a beautiful liturgy to celebrate the Feast Day of the Ascension. They shared with the school, that the Feast of the Ascension is the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, which commemorates the Ascension of Christ into heaven. They also asked us to consider how we know that Jesus is always with us.

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
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
The responses were really thoughtful, and demonstrated that the children understand that Christ is always with us.

Pope John Paul II stated that the rosary is a "sweet chain linking us to God" because it gives the faithful time to "contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love."



## Pentecost

St John Bosco Class led us in a beautiful liturgy, reminding us of the significance and importance of the feast day of Pentecost. They shared with us that Pentecost is fifty days after Easter Sunday, when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations.





Pentecost is also seen as the birthday of the Christian faith. It was right after Pentecost that Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily to Jews and other non-believers.

St John Bosco Class, reminded us to go out and live our mission, supported by the Holy Spirit.
