Prayers



GOSPEL (Matthew 21: 28-32)

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, "What do you think about this? A man had two sons. He went to one and said, 'My son, go and work in my vineyard today.' 'I will not go,' his son replied — but later he changed his mind and went. The man said the same thing to his other son, and the son replied, 'Yes, I will' — but he did not go. Which of the two sons did the will of their father?" "The first," they said. Then Jesus said to them, "I tell you truly that those we consider outcasts are going ahead of you into the kingdom of God. Routine medical and dental appointments should be scheduled for outside school time. Holidays in school time cannot be authorised.


