
D.E.A.R will run from **8:25-8:50**. All you have to do is follow your child into class and enjoy the books on offer.

New roofs for St Chad's!

We are delighted to announce that work will start on the flat roof rebuild and refurbishment project at St Chad's after the half term break. The school was successful in our bid for Condition Improvement Funding from the Department for Education coupled with contribution from our school budget.

During construction work, the areas will be fully enclosed, as the safety of the students is paramount, and building work has been scheduled so there will be no impact on the learning of our students. The works programme aims for the project to be completed by mid-March 2024.

The school site will look slightly different when we return on Monday 30 October with fencing and scaffolding in place but the entrance and exit routes will remain the same.

This is a wonderful opportunity for significant improvements and investment in the school building to improve the environment for our school community.

Winter uniform

The children will return from half term in winter uniform. Full details are available on the website but here is a summary, for your information.

St Chad's reversible black school coat
Or grey duffle coat (available from Bubblegum)
Grey or white socks or grey tights
Plain white school shirt – not blouse
St Chad's grey jumper or cardigan
Grey pinafore/skirt or short trousers
School tie (available from school)
St Chad's black ski hat
Black shoes – shoes need to be flat, robust and with a fastening to keep them on
such as Velcro, buckles or laces. Short boots (ankle boots), trainer type shoes,
ballet pumps, flashing lights etc are not allowed.
St Chad's book bag
St Chad's rucksack – Yr3 upwards only

Please note that the uniform policy also states the following:

Long trousers may be worn by boys Yrs1-6

No jewellery including watches may be worn but girls are permitted to wear small gold stud earrings only. No religious symbols to be worn (including crucifix on a chain).

Long hair must be tied back (boys and girls).

No overly long hair extensions, beads or head coverings.

Ribbons and hair fastenings must be yellow, grey, black or white only. (No beads or large decorative flowers etc) No gel, tramlines, or other shaved designs including Mohicans are allowed nor is a completely or closely shaved head.

All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the child's name.

Autism: Culturally Censored with Venessa Bobb

Venessa shares her lived experiences as a Black Autistic parent advocating for her adult Autistic children and others.

Venessa Bobb is an Autistic mother of two young adults diagnosed Autistic and ADHD. Venessa battled for years for her middle child. Cultural differences brought isolation, loneliness and a breakdown of communication. Venessa's lived experiences helped to pave the way in providing advice, support and information when supporting different communities. Venessa has spoken nationally and internationally speaking on taboos, myths and stigma within the Black and Brown communities. "Without our voices, one can't be inclusive".


