Foundation Governor Roles at St Chad's

Background

The governing body's responsibility is to work in partnership with the school's senior leaders to promote continuous improvement in the performance of the school, whilst developing its Catholic ethos. This involves establishing a development plan; setting challenging, but achievable targets; interpreting information to assess progress and supporting Christ-centred and Christ-like teaching and learning for all.

The governing body has statutory responsibility for overseeing the school's financial viability and is the employer of all staff. Aligned to its improvement role, the governing body is there to be a 'critical friend', providing the right balance between supporting and challenging the performance of both the leadership team and the school.

There are different routes by which different types of governors are appointed and there are rules regulating the composition of the governing body. However, once appointed, all governors have equal status, regardless of the category under which they have been appointed. The role of governor is a voluntary one and is unpaid.

Foundation governors are appointed by the Archbishop to ensure the school's particular character is preserved and developed. As such, all foundation governors must be practising Catholics.

Fr David's Visit

On Wednesday Fr. David from St John's Church in Kensel Green came

in to talk to Yr2,3,4 & 6 about a tryptic he had commissioned for his church. He spoke about St Martin and St Josephine, and about the image of the Windrush which features in the main panel. The children were really interested and asked pertinent questions.



Health warning about vaping- message from the Police and Public Health

The Metropolitan Police has contacted Public Health raising serious concerns in relation to vaping. A small number of vapes have been found to contain dangerous and addictive substances such as 'Spice' and high levels of TBC, the psychoactive chemical found in cannabis. 'Spice' is a nickname for a substance containing one or more synthetic cannabinoids.

Earlier this week, in the London region, vapes containing 'Spice' resulted in five young people aged 14-16 being hospitalised with relatively serious health harms. There were other recent incidents of vapes containing cannabis or 'Spice' from areas elsewhere in the country. In the latest London incident, the vape was a blue and purple coloured rechargeable metal vape device labelled 'Vaporesso', which held blue liquid residues within a clear plastic chamber of a silver and black cartridge. Please be aware of these potential health threats.



Yr5 Wetlands Centre

Yr5 children had a great day at the Wetland Centre, they experienced the beauty of nature and learnt about Ava's adventures. The staff commented on how enthusiastic and well behaved the children were. A highly recommended trip for all the family.
